



MANDATORY HORSE HEALTH DECLARATION

Presentation of this duly completed and signed Mandatory Horse Health Declaration is a condition of entry to the Tom Quilty.



This declaration must be fully completed, signed and provided to the Camp allocation officer on arrival of the horse(s) at the St. Helens ride base. Failure to provide this completed and signed Horse Health Declaration shall result in refusal of entry to the grounds for the horse(s).

What is required?

All horses (including companion and alternate horses) which you intend bringing to the Tom Quilty must have their rectal temperature taken twice daily and recorded in the temperature log table below. You must begin taking and recording the temperature from Monday the 28th May 2012 and continue each day until your horse(s) enters the ride base at which time you must provide this document to the Camp allocation officer who will retain it.

What should I do if my horse's temperature exceeds 38.5C after the 28/05/12 but before I leave home?

You should immediately contact your local veterinarian and heed your local veterinarian's advice whether to travel your horse. If you do travel your horse, a veterinary examination report stating the reason for the increased temperature must accompany this document and be provided to the camp allocation officer on arrival of the horse at the St. Helens ride base.

What should I do if my horse's temperature exceeds 38.5C after the 28/05/12 and whilst in transit to the Tom Quilty?

You should immediately contact the nearest veterinarian and heed their advice whether to continue travelling. If you do continue to travel your horse to the event, a veterinary examination report stating the reason for the increased temperature must accompany this document and be provided to the camp allocation officer on arrival of the horse at the St. Helens ride base.

Do I need to continue to take my horses temperature after I arrive at ride base?

Yes, you are required to take your horses temperature twice daily up until and including Thursday evening the 07/06/12. The temperature must be recorded on the "Ride base temperature log sheet" (page 4 below) and must be produced on demand if so requested by a veterinarian, Chief Steward or their delegate.

What should I do if my horse's temperature exceeds 38.5C during my period at ride base?

If your horse's temperature exceeds 38.5C during your period at ride base the Head Vet or Chief Steward must be advised immediately.

Declaration by owner or person in charge:

I the person named on page 2 above, declare that the horse(s) named above has/have been in good health, eating normally and has/have not shown signs of illness since Monday 28th May 2012. I give my authorization for the Chief Steward or his delegate to call for a veterinary inspection of the horse(s) named above, should they show signs of illness at any time whilst at the venue. I agree to pay any veterinary fees incurred as a result of this.

I further agree;

1. That all horses were shampooed, rinsed and allowed to dry, and their hooves picked clean of all solid material prior to departure from the property of origin.
2. That all vehicles and equipment accompanying the horses were in a clean condition at the start of travel to the Tom Quilty.
3. That failure to comply with items (1) and (2) above may result in refusal of entry to the event venue and disciplinary action by my relevant State Management Committee.
4. To be bound by any directions given by AERA Chief Stewards, Veterinarians and the Event Organisers.
5. That in the event of horse movement restrictions, I agree to be responsible for the care, maintenance, feeding and watering of the horses named on page 2 at my own cost.
